New Performing Arts Director heard sound of music

James E. Phillips, the new director of North Atlanta's Performing Arts Center, knows personally the power of art encountered at an early age.

Mr. Phillips trained for a career in finance but kept hearing the church music he'd been immersed in as a young child. After receiving an MBA in finance from Xavier University in Cincinnati, he was working as a financial analyst for Xerox in Rochester, N.Y. when he decided to return to the music that he began pursuing at age 5, when his parents enrolled him in private piano lessons in Cleveland, Ohio. The youngest of 10, the son of a Baptist pastor, he was involved in church music as a soloist and pianist, often working with an older sibling to organize and rehearse choirs.

Leaving the world of business behind, he changed careers, receiving a master's of music in music education and returning to

his old high school as choral director. At the school, he received awards and special recognition for the quick revitalization of the choral program. He's now working on his doctorate in music education from Kent State.

Mr. Phillips brings his joy in music and his leadership skills from the financial world to North Atlanta. He's formed a parents' group for the drama program and is energetically seeking to increase community support for the theater by aggressively marketing tickets and boosting

parental support. His background in music will enhance the school's strong orchestra, band, choral and dance programs. He possesses the leadership to restore North Atlanta's prominence as one of the top high school performing arts programs in the nation.

During his doctoral work at Kent State in music education, Mr. Phillips has traveled to concerts in the United States and Jamaica as graduate assistant and pianist. He has assisted
